Elite Scholars Academy administrators and teachers have evaluated student performance data to determine areas needing improvement to increase proficiency in all academic areas.

District Instructional Priorities

The district has identified four instructional priorities on which we will focus our work:

- Literacy across the curriculum
- Numeracy across the curriculum
- Critical thinking
- Integrating technology into the curriculum

In 6th grade, the content area goals are aligned with the district, state and national goals of preparing students to be college or career ready when they exit Elite Scholars. Instructional time will focus on understanding and application of major concepts or themes in each of the content areas:

Math: Algebra, Geometry, Statistics, and Number System Fluency.

Language Arts: Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking.

Social Studies: Geography, Economy, Government and History of Europe, Australia, Canada, and Latin America.

Science: Geology, Hydrology, Meteorology, and Astronomy.
